"Thirty-five years ago, it was pretty unusual to find blacks on skis," said NBS (National Brotherhood of Skiers) President Rose Thomas Pickrum. "We came together as groups because we wanted to ski with other people just like us." Fourteen members of the Houston Ski Jammers joined other African-American skiers from clubs in Texas and around the nation for the annual NBS Summit meeting/Challenge Cup in Breckenridge, CO to celebrate the 35th anniversary of the founding of the NBS.

The Ski Jammers was organized as a club in 1982 and in 1983 became a member club in the NBS, and in 1985 joined the Texas Ski Council (TSC). A strong mission of the

not only through the NBS, but in conjunction with the TSC, which three years ago set up a Foundation to promote physical fitness for young people and their families through snow sports by offering affordable ski/snowboard programs and travel assistance for youth participants on designated TSC trips. Since the beginning of the TSC program the Jammers have sent one of the largest contingents to the Fall Roundup trip over the Thanksgiving holiday. This past year's Jammer trip was led by long-time Ski Jammers and TSC supporter William Jackson. William has served on the TSC board in years past and has been a major contributor to the success of the TSC Youth Foundation in recent years.

The club also participates in the NBS Olympic Scholarship Fund which strives to train black skiers for ski and snowboard competition on the international level. "There's never been a black skier that has earned a medal in the Olympics," said Pickrum. "We're hoping

that will occur in 2010." The NBS member clubs contribute funds to the Olympic Scholarship Fund to support the young athletes' and their families in training for competitions and are also seeking major corporate sponsors to assist them in achieving their goals.

Even if it doesn't happen at the next Olympics, members of the Jammers' know they've already achieved a lot. Ski Jammers President Bruce Stewart commented, "Just seeing other black skiers from all over the country getting together for a week of skiing, boarding, racing, and lots of off-the-slope fun makes this (NBS Summit) the premier event of every ski season."

The TSC applauds the Ski Jammers, along with all its other TSC member clubs, for giving youth the opportunity to dream, as they develop their skills in snow sports – where ever that dream might take them. We can only hope that by the young people's involvement in the two programs that a Texan will be on the Winner's platform accepting an Olympic medal someday very soon.

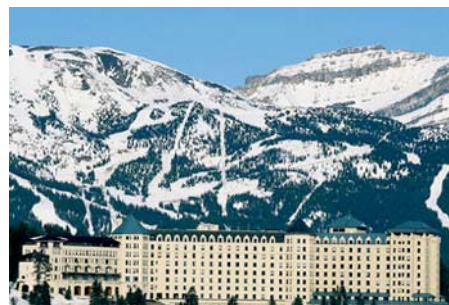

Our hosts at the Chateau Frontenac set up a nicely appointed gathering spot and in an adjoining ballroom treated the group to a double feature of recent movies. Free popcorn also! ## Texas Ski Council Youth Foundation

### *It's all about the KIDS*

In today's world of increasing childhood obesity, the TSC Youth Foundation (TSCTF) was created to help promote family exercise in the winter months. By partnering with resorts in the ski industry the TSCYF also promotes the family unit by requiring that the children attend with adult family members. The Texas Ski Council through their individual club delegates voted in August 2004 to create a Youth Foundation. The Texas Ski Council Youth Foundation was established and received \$10,000 seed money from the TSC. With this seed money the Foundation has created ongoing programs to assist families with transportation expenses while the resorts provide discounted lessons. This money will provide the opportunity for children from all socio-economic levels to experience winter sports in a family setting. The first expenditures from the Youth Foundation were for the TSC Fall Roundup November 22-27, 2005, during the Thanksgiving Holiday.

The Texas Ski Council Youth Program's first year was a great success. The Youth Program introduced snow sports to 37 enthusiastic kids and their parents. In the first year of the Program the TSC provided the initial funding which allowed us to offer a 4-day youth package for less than \$200 and to subsidize the

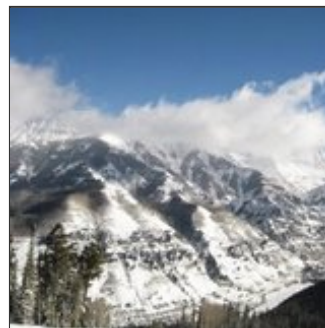


transportation cost of each participant by \$100. Now that the Youth Foundation has been granted a 501(c)(3) Non Profit Deductible status by the IRS we hope to raise enough funds each year to continue to assist with transportation costs as well as to subsidize the rising cost of the lessons.

During the ski season of 2006-2007 the TSCYF took 63 children to the youth camp held at Breckenridge over the Thanksgiving period. During the Thanksgiving 2007 trip the foundation took 83 kids back to Keystone for the final year of the current resort contract. Those 83 kids in the youth camp do not include the other children traveling with the TSC. We had over 100 children participate in the 2007 Thanksgiving trip at Keystone! And we hope to continue this growth with even more children participating in the youth camp at Winter Park this Thanksgiving.

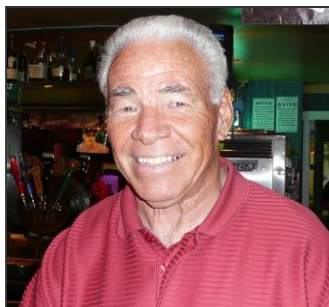

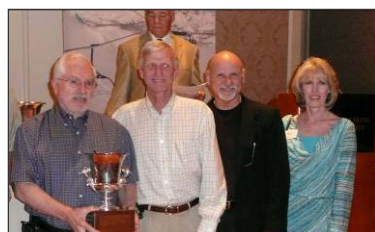
