



The Galapagos Islands...the adventure of a lifetime and the destination of the 2012 TSC Summer Expedition. This trip will truly be an ACTIVE adventure and different from most trips to the Galapagos in that it is land

based. Each day will be a new adventure...snorkeling, scuba diving, hiking, kayaking, visiting the Charles Darwin Research Center and the transfer between islands via boat where it is very likely to see dolphins and whales. We will be travelling in "pods" of 16 with 4 pods on each departure. During the day, each pod will more than likely have a different "route" so we do not tax the local environment. During the evening, we will have time to gather as a group and party with friends from different pods. Pre and post trips to the Amazon Jungle and Otavalo in the highlands, and a 4 day or 7 day post trip to Peru are available for those who wish to spend more time in South America.

Departure dates are August 1, August 8 and August 15. Price varies according to departure date. International airfare is not included. Space available on all departures.




In Memorium. Rick Wheeler

Three members of our TSC family were in a tragic car accident on their way to Snowmass for the TSC Traditional trip. Rick Wheeler of Capital Downhill, Rollo Gurss and his daughter Kimber Gurss of the Texas Twisters were headed to Snowmass when the car lost control during the snowstorm on January 7th. The car rolled several times. Kimber and Rollo were bruised and scraped up, but were released from the hospital with minor injuries. However, Rick's injuries were more extensive. Rick was transported to a Denver hospital where his family and friends hoped for his recovery and awakening. On January 22, Rick passed away with family and friends at his side.

Rick Wheeler was born in Great Falls, Montana but called Austin, Texas his home. He was a retired Air Force pilot and was planning to attend his Air Force Academy class 50th anniversary reunion this fall. Rick was active in the TSC as a Delegate for his club for years. He participated

on numerous TSC committees. Rick is survived by his son and daughterin-law, Rock and Romi Wheeler of Granite Falls, N.C.: daughter, Kathleen Wheeler of Nashville. Tenn.; his mother, Ruth Wheeler of Austin; ex-wife Rachel Jackson: and two grandchildren.
